Hibs' Head Coach Neil Lennon is not concerned about extending the gap between his team and Dundee United when the sides meet at Easter Road this afternoon as there is still a lot of football to be played.

United along with Hibs were favourites for automatic promotion, but Ray McKinnon's side have yet to hit the form expected from them and Lennon thinks that they will be trying to prove a point.
