Individuals and groups, supported by a charity or organisation, as well as charities and organisations themselves, can submit an application to receive up to £5,000 worth of funding per project. The total fund available is £40,000 and has been jointly funded by Police Scotland, City of Edinburgh Council and Scottish Government and will help deliver activities and solutions to help reduce prejudice and foster positive relationships. This could be through a series of events designed to bring communities together, working with perpetrators of hate crime to change attitudes, producing and delivering learning materials, or an idea of your very own. The Edinburgh public will decide which applications are successful. The closing date is 12 December. Spread the word!
