Coach Graham Moodie was pleased with some aspects of the performance against the top team in the division but rued defensive lapses which Grange punished.

Bromac Kelburne, who are second with 18 points from seven starts, a point behind Grange, will also punish mistakes if they happen in the game at Glasgow's National Hockey Centre (12.00).
