Ice Hockey — Peacock confident as Clan head for Murrayfield

EDINBURGH Capitals lost 5-2 the last time Braehead Clan came to Murrayfield on Elite League business and coach Michal Dobron does not want a repeat.

It's only the second meeting between the pair in the Elite League so far this season and Clan's British-born forward Craig Peacock believes his club are on the up.

It's been a difficult spell but the player added: "We've put in some really good performances.

"We've been unlucky not to come away with more points than we have.

"Our team is definitely going in the right direction."

Elsewhere, Fife Flyers make their first visit of the season to Nottingham Panthers (4pm) and are boosted by a 4-1 victory at

The Fife Ice Arena earlier this season.

It could be ideal time to visit as Panthers have been in free-fall of late, losing their last six league games.

Dundee Stars, meanwhile, entertain Manchester Storm, a side they edged 3-2 on their last visit.

And Dundee also won 3-2 after penalty shots on a recent visit to The Storm Shelter.
