

# Witness appeal after woman assaulted on Glenrothes to Edinburgh train



A police investigation is underway after a woman was slapped in the face by another passenger in the front carriage of a train travelling between Glenrothes and Edinburgh.

The incident took place around 9pm on October 22.

The suspect, who was a white male, bald and wearing a Stone Island jacket, is believed to have been with a larger group of men.

The victim, who was in her early to mid 20, with blonde hair and was wearing a bomber jacket and black legging, has not reported the incident to police, but officers are keen to speak to her about what happened.

She was accompanied by a man and was “sobbing uncontrollably” when she got off the train at Dalmeny Station at 9.47pm.

Constable Liam Harper of British Transport Police said: “We would like to speak to the woman who was hurt in this incident as we believe it left her extremely distressed.

“Violence of this nature is completely unacceptable and so I urge anyone who saw the incident, or knows what happened, to get in touch immediately.”
