Edinburgh Capitals must give No 1 netminder Travis Fullerton more protection. That's the view of Jacob Johnston ahead of the club's visit to Braehead Clan on Saturday (7pm)."

It's a return to Travis Fullerton's former club — he played 13 games for Braehead last season — and defenceman Johnston believes the Canadian stopper gives bottom-markers Capitals a chance to win because of his consistently high performances.
