Police appeal after van driver attacked on A71 between Hermiston and Dalmahoy



A police investigation is underway following an attempted murder on the A71 between Hermiston and Dalmahoy, at the junction Curriehill Road.

The incident happened around 9.15pm on Sunday, December 11, when a 23-year-old was driving a yellow Ford Transit from Edinburgh towards Livingston.

He became aware of a black car driving very close to him and stopped. Once both vehicles were stationary the male driver of the black car approached the Transit and attacked the 23-year-old, who was in the driver's seat.

The suspect quickly returned to his car and left in the direction of Edinburgh.

The 23-year-old sustained a puncture wound to the right side of his chest. He was taken to Edinburgh Royal Infirmary, Edinburgh, where he is currently detained in a stable condition.

Officers are now investigating and are appealing for information.

The suspect is described a white man with a light brown beard. He was wearing a black hooded top with the hood up and dark gloves.

Detective Sergeant Martin McKay of Corstorphine CID said:

"This was a brutal attack on a member of the public and we are eager to trace the man responsible as soon as possible.

"I would urge anyone who recognises the description of the man, or saw either a black car or a yellow Ford Transit on the A71 around 9.15pm on Sunday, December 11, to get in touch with us immediately."
