Neil Lennon's assistant Garry Parker insists that he is not even considering losing to second placed Dundee United in front of a packed Easter Road tonight.

"He is very quick, direct and takes people on and he is a good addition to the squad.

"Teams come here and sit in but he is a little bit different and he can get in behind and it's just what we need.

Hopefully John McGinn may be there or there abouts and we will see how he is. we've missed two midfield players for a bit of time and we are still at the top of the league without them so it will be just like having two new signings when they come back.
