

Men's indoor hockey league resumes after winter break



Grange could help Edinburgh rivals Inverleith by beating current Division One pace-setters Bromac Kelburne when the men's indoor league resumes on Saturday after the winter break writes Nigel Duncan.

Grange do, however, have a big task as they have won three of their five games so far while Kelburne are unbeaten with four wins and a draw and have collected 13 points while the Edinburgh club are on nine points.
