

Hockey – Grange close the gap

EDINBURGH side Grange closed the gap on Division One pace-setters Bromac Kelburne to two points yesterday thanks to a 4-1 win at Western Wildcats.

Grange led 2-0 at the break and ran out 4-1 winners, Western scoring their consolation late on.

Andrew Brogdon, one of Grange's coaching team, said he was pleased with the performance, particularly as this was the club's first game back after the winter shutdown.
