Based on professional reviews by travel guides, magazines and newspapers, the Experts' Choice Award is given annually to well-reviewed and recommended attractions around the world.

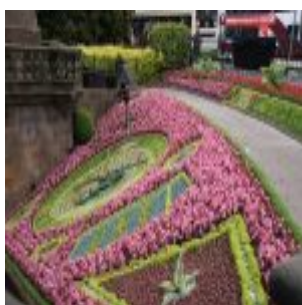
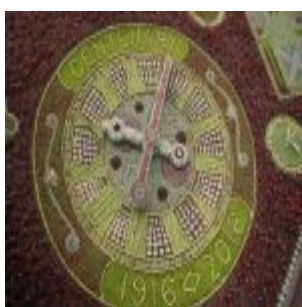
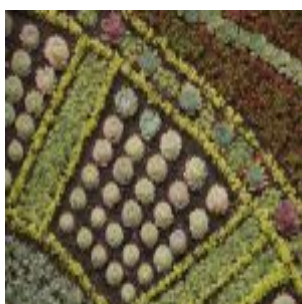
This year, Princes Street Gardens also received travel review website TripExpert's Best of Edinburgh award, which recognises the most worthwhile landmarks to visit in the capital.

Princes Street Gardens was first established in the early 19th century, and is listed in the Inventory of Gardens and Designed Landscape in Scotland, assessed as outstanding for its aesthetic, historical, architectural and scenic values.

Amongst key features, the Gardens house the world-famous floral clock, first planted in 1903, and several significant monuments and memorials, including the Scott Monument in East Princes Street Gardens.
