She will be walking rain or shine, night and day, raising money for UK Action For Refugees. Unfortunately, her only training so far has been late night drinking and Zumba classes.

It's not clear yet if she s going to make it but hopefully she'll learn a thing or two about moving forward even in bleak circumstances.
