

Government welcomes new figures on positive destinations for university graduates



Higher Education Minister Shirley-Anne Somerville has welcomed the publication of new statistics showing 91 per cent of Scotland's university graduates are going into positive destinations.

Statistics released by the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) show that Scotland's graduates have maintained a high percentage of leavers going into work or further study and a higher median salary for full-time first degree leavers compared to the other nations of the UK.

The report also highlights that 93 per cent of those that studied a 'Science subject' have gone on to employment, further study or a combination of the two, the highest level of all the UK countries.

Ms Somerville, said: "These are very positive statistics with 91 per cent of our university graduates are going into positive destinations, either work or further study.
