"He did really well last year and he couldn't have asked for a better one.

"Hopefully I can have the same success as he did. He had a fantastic year, he was playing some great football with Celtic.

"I didn't speak with him about the move. He was on his preseason and I was on mine.

"It's really my decision and I thought this was the best move for me."
