The test (which is usually only applied in an eye hospital) will measure the complex muscles that move the eyes, determining which muscles and nerves require treatment, when someone has double vision or neurological problems.

It will continue to offer Digital Precision Eyecare, a cutting-edge way of selecting and fitting customers' glasses, using imaging software on tablet devices.

As well as making up to 80 more appointments available per week, the revamp will see customers being offered an extended range of Specsavers' own and designer frames to choose from.
