Stewart Dickson believes Glasgow owe it to their fans to show some steel against Sheffield Tigers on Tuesday at Ashfield despite facing a huge task to make the SGB Championship playoff final.

Dickson admits it's a tough ask to turn over the league's top side but said: "We are all together as a team but I need to see signs that the riders want it as much as I want it and the owners want it.

"It's not quite done yet and, until it's mathematically impossible, we're going to have to give it a go. We owe it to our supporters."
