## Citylink introduce 24 hour Edinburgh to Glasgow service

The 900 service is a familiar sight on Edinburgh city centre streets and now it will run 24 hours a day seven days a week to connect the capital to Glasgow. Tickets will be £7.60 single and £10.00 return. If you buy in advance the return is £7.60.

This means that the service will offer 50 journeys each way every 15 minutes, and additional stops will include Edinburgh Airport between 11.00pm and 4.00am and Maxim Office Park between 1.00am and 4.00 am.

This is great news for those travelling to Glasgow for concerts when the only way back would be a taxi if you missed the last bus or train.
