Victoria Hislop said : "I will be talking about "Cartes Postales from Greece" my latest novel which takes the reader on a journey around my favourite country – and will also touch on my experience of writing 'The Island' my first novel, set on the former leprosy island of Spinalonga in Crete – a place and an experience which literally changed my life."

Ross Kerry, Community Fundraising Manager for Lepra, said: "Leprosy is most prevalent in extremely poor countries,

where people are often unable seek the medical treatment they so desperately need. The funds raised from this event really do make such a difference – as it enables our teams to find and treat as many people as possible."
