

Balfour congratulates Granton Community Gardeners

Jeremy Balfour, Scottish Conservative MSP for the Lothian Region raised a motion at the Scottish Parliament this week, congratulating Granton Community Gardeners on being awarded £78,534 from the Big Lottery Fund. Over £1 million of funding was handed out to Scottish organisations.



Granton Community Gardeners, a well-established community organisation aims to enhance their local area by creating street corner gardens, encouraging local residents to get involved in gardening and hosting events with meals cooked from ingredients grown in their gardens, such as harvest celebrations, BBQs and an annual ceilidh.

They have drop in gardening sessions twice weekly and the whole garden is shared rather than being split into plots. From the community meals initiative the Gardeners' Café was set up in 2014.
