Edinburgh Capitals co-coach Mike D'Orazio remembers how well the squad played when they edged Belfast Giants 6-4 in the Challenge Cup at The Odyssey earlier this season.

The Murrayfield men also pushed Giants in a 6-5 defeat in Edinburgh in the same competition.

D'Orazio wants that application and effort when Capitals aim to snap a nine-game losing streak when they visit high-flying Giants on Friday (7pm).

It's the club's first visit to Northern Ireland in the Elite League this season, but second-placed Belfast already hold two wins over the Scots this season at Murrayfield.

"We held Braehead to 22 shots on Wednesday and I believe we played well in the game.

"It's a long trip but we still have the nucleus of the team which won there earlier in the season."
