Suicide prevention boost

Scotmid customers and staff have raised £121,000 for suicide prevention charity Samaritans.

This funded 24,200 calls from Scots who may be struggling to cope over the last six months.

Every year, around 700 people take their own lives in Scotland and last year saw the first rise in Scotland's suicide rate for six years.

The charity currently receives around 300,000 calls in Scotland annually and the partnership hopes to raise a further f180,000 to ensure the charity's 19 branches across Scotland can keep their doors open.

John Brodie, Scotmid chief executive, said: "Samaritans provides an incredibly valuable service to local communities.

"Every donation large or small has the potential to make a big difference in ensuring Samaritans can be there when it matters."

James Jopling, Samaritans' executive director in Scotland said: "Samaritans is there for anyone struggling to cope, no

matter the day or time."
