The local Councillors persuaded Council officers and leasing Councillors to defer the report beyond the March to the June Finance and Resources Committee, in line with what Action Porty intended to ask. This will give us further time to flesh out the ideas nearly 600 of us came up with that Making Places weekend and involve more local people, and professionals in proper consideration of those proposals.



Our fab community newspaper also needs updating in so far as the delayed Transport and Environmental Committee met last Friday afternoon. One of the items was the vexed question of Setted Streets, like Brighton Place. Some of the substantive Members of the Committee had other engagements, so Councillor Kate Campbell and I substituted for colleagues. I have surveyed my inbox, the social media comments and 'likes' and direct messages and can confirm that, in all the sound and fury of the local debate, around 70% are in support of the decision we made, unanimously, to reinstate the setts. This will be the first end-to-end reconstruction of Brighton Place in the last 45 years at least. The final setted street design will be consulted upon with the four Local Councillors. We will all continue to take a keen interest in this issue which has been so very controversial.
