National charity Hearing Dogs for Deaf People's much-loved Great British Dog Walk is back and it's returning to Holyrood Park, Edinburgh on Sunday 25th March.

The series of dog walks is firmly established as a UK favourite among Britain's dog-loving nation. Over 150 dogs of all shapes and sizes and around 350 adults, children and families are expected to take part in this year's event at Holyrood Park, Edinburgh.

There are two options of walks on the day — either 5km or 6.5km routes making it an ideal event for dog-lovers, families, walkers and organised walking groups.

The Great British Dog Walk at Holyrood Park, Edinburgh is one of 20 fun-filled walks taking place around the UK helping to ensure more hearing dogs can be trained to bring life-changing benefits to deaf people and help them reconnect with their family, friends, and community around them, like local Hearing Dog recipient Alison Macdonald. Originally from Aberdeen but now living in Edinburgh, Alison was successfully matched with

a Poodle called Fergus. They have an incredibly strong bond and Fergus found fame having appeared on STV news, when Alison gave an interview about her life with Fergus.

Alison, who now lives in Musselburgh, has been profoundly deaf since birth and feels her life changed for the better when she met her hearing dog Fergus. Alison says: "I cannot imagine my life without Fergus, he makes me feel safe when I'm at home and more confident when I'm out. Fergus alerts me to things such as the fire alarm, cooker timer and the doorbell."

There is a free limited-edition Great British Dog Walk doggie bandana for each adult ticket purchased and a chance to meet some of the amazing Hearing Dogs. There will also be fun activities for all the family, as well as stalls with gifts and refreshments.
