Scottish Thistle Awards 2018

A pub in Edinburgh and an outdoor adventure park in East Lothian won the Scottish tourism industry's equivalent of the Oscars at last night's Scottish Thistle Awards at the EICC.



This is the 25th year of the awards and at the start of the evening host Jennifer Reoch asked for anyone who had ever won a Thistle Award to stand up. There were award winners all over the room, and at that stage some hopefuls for 2018.

There are many categories and opportunities for businesses to be recognised among their peers. Teuchters Landing in Leith was named Best Pub fighting off competition from across Scotland.
