The royal celebration will continue at Low Parks Museum commemorating the 450th anniversary of the last visit of Mary Queen of Scots. Live demonstrations will explore Mary Queen of Scots' life in the 16th century, with a focus on her fashion

and extravagant lifestyle.

There are events for festivalgoers of all ages with 'Magic at the Museum' — a multi-sensory arts experience in Kilmarnock exploring time travel through storytelling, drama, puppet making and film, and 'Generation Dance' where audiences will be led on a hilarious journey through generations of dance in Dundee. Dancers of all ages will waltz, jive and bust their moves across the galleries.

Now in its 12th year, Festival of Museums welcomes a number of new venues to the line-up, including: Edinburgh's outstanding Jupiter Artland sculpture park; Skelmorlie Secret Bunker, where visitors descend 15 foot underground to get a chilling insight into the Cold War; and St Ronan's Wells, a historic spa overlooking Leithen Valley.
