Edinburgh-born coach Tony Hand saluted his battling Great Britain under-18s squad who secured promotion to Division I, Group B, of the World Championship on a dramatic final day in Tallinn.

Hand and his assistant, former Edinburgh Capitals legend Martin Cingel, guided the squad to a gutsy 4-3 victory in their final game after being 3-0 ahead after 23 minutes.

Poland then dropped a point against hosts Estonia meaning Hand's side took the gold medal.

Earlier, Poland claimed a 3-0 lead and promotion lookout out but Estonia tied the game at 3-3 by the end of 60 minutes.

Hand, a former Ayr Scottish Eagles, Dundee Stars and Murrayfield Racers star, said: "This is an amazing achievement. The boys did a fantastic job and everyone pulled together."

The squad also lost Kirkcaldy-born Caly Robertson, who plays with Edinburgh Capitals, in an early game after he dislocated his shoulder.

And Hand and his coaching team had to reshuffle but Hand said: "We knew we were up against some great opposition, but we have come on leaps and bounds (as a squad).
