

New visitors pass provides free access to many Borders attractions

Locals and visitors to the capital this summer can now take advantage of a new pass which offers free access to a number of nearby attractions.

With the 'Beyond Edinburgh' pass you can visit Rosslyn Chapel, Butterfly and Insect World and the National Mining Museum Scotland in Midlothian plus Abbotsford House, Trimontium Roman Museum and Hop-on-Hop-off Bus Tour in the Scottish Borders.

A number of local offers and savings for restaurants and retailers across the regions are also included in the pass, along with discounted entry to Arniston House in Midlothian and Dryburgh and Melrose Abbey in the Scottish Borders.



The pass costs from £24 per adult and £10 per child, and can be used until 31 October 2018. A number of accommodation partners are available on the Beyond Edinburgh website for those purchasing a two day pass and who intend to stay overnight.
