Julia Linstead, an artist from the Scottish Borders, sandblasts original designs on glass. Julia's unique etchings mostly focus on floral patterns that are carefully selected according to the shape and colour of vessels and vases hand-blown by Jane Charles, with whom Julia collaborates.
