Roddy Smith, Chief Executive of Essential Edinburgh said, "Our businesses have left us in no doubt that tackling rough sleeping and begging in the city centre is a key priority, and we can best do this by supporting the fantastic third sector organisations in the city who are doing an excellent job in supporting the homeless community.
