Carol Hudson, 54, was diagnosed with a brain tumour nearly five years ago. After initial treatment, Carol thought she was well again, however, in 2016 the cancer returned for a second time and this time it was incurable. Carol started to attend Maggie's during her radiotherapy and describes it as her 'second home'.

The mum-of-two has taken part in the Edinburgh Culture Crawls for the past two years as a way of saying thank you for the support Maggie's has given her and her family.

Carol said: "Cancer is a debilitating disease but if you

strive to do your best then, hopefully you can. The Culture Crawls are such good fun. The walk itself is physically challenging but you get to see the city and it's venues in a new light; you see inside some of the places you may just have passed along the way and get to know the history of them and there's lots of fun, food and entertainment along the route."

Carol added: "The services that Maggie's are able to provide are absolutely brilliant. Maggie's is just an amazing place. They make you realise that there are plenty of reasons to be getting up in the morning and there's still plenty to smile about. I would walk over hot coals for them!"
