Emerson Hyndman looking to secure regular starting place in Hibs' team

It was the American international's first full 90 minutes of action and his performance impressed the fans, testing Dons' keeper Joe Lewis on two occasions.

"It is something we will work on and hopefully in the next match it will work out in our favour."

"I felt alright. I felt sharp. It's not easy coming off the back of a year not playing, so I'm trying to adapt as quick as I can and getting back up to match fitness and everything like that.

"But yeah, I felt good in the game. Being with the lads over the period of time that I've been here has been really helpful and I'm settling in with them and learning how they play.

"It felt good to get the 90 minutes in the last game and I hope to get more minutes soon."

"No game is easy and I expect a tough game against St Mirren, just like I do with any other game. The team has prepared well on the back of a disappointing result. We're definitely looking to put it right.

"We are carrying confidence as well knowing that we played well on Tuesday but just didn't get what we wanted and we're in good shape."
