If you're an experienced player, or if you've never picked up a racket before there's something for you being served up in the free programme for adults and children alike.

The opening represents the culmination of a collaboration between Edinburgh Leisure, Tennis Scotland, and **sport**scotland to redevelop the outdoor courts at Craiglockhart.

The front four courts have been reconfigured and extended to create five courts, all with floodlights. There is a centre court which will allow major tournaments to be played there with accommodation for spectators. All the courts have a new all-weather artificial clay surface, which will allow them to be used all year round.

Kirsty Stobie, Manager at Edinburgh Leisure's Craiglockhart Tennis Centre said: "Edinburgh Leisure is very grateful to Tennis Scotland and **sport**scotland for their funding contribution. We're thrilled that the new surface will allow us to continue to host the Nike Junior International and the Scottish Junior Open Championships each year, which will bring the outdoor courts alive with talented players from all over the world coming to participate.

"The surface will help support the development of our junior

players within Edinburgh Leisure's programme as well as the local development squads supported by Tennis Scotland and can also be enjoyed my members of the public."

Craiglockhart Leisure and Tennis Centre is also the home of Tennis Scotland, part of the Lawn Tennis Association, the governing body for tennis in Scotland responsible for growing participation and supporting the long-term development of talented players.



Blane Dodds from Tennis Scotland said: "It is fantastic to see the development of the outdoor courts at Craiglockhart come to fruition. Tennis Scotland was delighted to be able to support the development of these courts including floodlights through the Tennis Scotland Community Fund. It has been great to watch the project develop from the Tennis Scotland office and we are looking forward to start seeing players of all ages and abilities stepping out on the courts to enjoy the new court facilities. These courts will play a big part in our competitions calendar as well supporting in our drive to grow and develop tennis in Scotland.

There have been some notable matches played on the outdoor tennis courts at Craiglockhart with world-famous players from Jimmy Connors and John McEnroe in the 1970s to Andy Murray in the 90s.

Craiglockhart Tennis Centre has six indoor courts and a further three outdoor clay courts at the back of the building in addition to these new courts, a cycling studio and Harry's Café. Its Leisure Centre also boasts a spacious gym with over 70 pieces of kit, fitness studios, squash courts and a multipurpose sports hall.
