Independent Councillor Gavin Barrie said: 'I may not agree with much of what Cllr Arthur says or how he carries out his political role as an elected member, but I always judged him as politically astute.

"It would appear my judgement was flawed. This Tweet shocked those of us in both local and national politics, and not only those of us who might oppose Cllr Arthur's political point of view.

"His unreserved apology is welcome but doubts will remain about why he thought this tweet, judged racially motivated by many, was ever appropriate."
