I met David MacLeod the Brand Manager of Rowan who was visiting for the day. He started his working life at The

Scotsman a few years back, and is Edinburgh born and bred. This is his hometown so don't be fooled by his accent!

Mr MacLeod looks after the Head Office site for the business, but manages the design team within that. He looks after all the designers, technical pattern writers and the yarn development. He told me about the way that Rowan is embracing the renaissance of knitting as a hobby.

David said: "Knitting is on the up and up. Crafts tend to go in a seven year cycle and we are definitely on the crest of a wave right now. We have lots of knitters coming in. 'Slow fashion' is coming back, it is seen as the proper way to go. We have a collaboration with a whole teaching project called Knitting for All which is about teaching young knitters and new knitters."
