## Indoor hockey — Inverleith open against Grange

He added: "However, we have a number of the players also now have the experience of playing in Europe.

"In addition, Patrick Christie and Ewen Mackie have indoor Scotland caps from last season.

"Three game days are always challenging and each team will provide a different challenge for us whether through style of play or changes in personnel.

"It should certainly give us an indication of where we are at and what needs to be worked on."
