Fingal launches today berthed in the Port of Leith.



The former Northern Lighthouse Board Ship has cabins named after Stevenson lighthouses, inspired by her maritime heritage. There is a luxury cabin with private deck, a duplex cabin with living space or the stunning Skerryvore suite with extensive outdoor space to relax and entertain. The finishes are all carefully chosen with polished woods and nautical notes, Scottish leathers and finest linens accord with colours inspired by Fingal's past.



Launched in 1963 the ship was the last to be built by Blythswood Ship Building Company in Glasgow and she patrolled waters off Oban keeping lighthouses there and their keepers in

order.
