"We regularly look after many of the leading aficionados of the sport in the UK during the grading weekends, usually around every two months, and now we are going one step better with the Umpires Course," said Alan.

"Last year saw 50 years of Taekwon-Do in the UK, and it's growing in popularity all the time. We want to do all we can to promote it here in the UK and Scotland," said Tommy Wallace.

"We are looking forward to hearing all about Grandmaster Hutchison's trip to Pyongyang in North Korea last November to mark what would have been the 100th birthday of Taekwon-Do founder, General Choi," said Tommy. "It was attended by many Masters from all over the world."

The BITF has produced many champions at National, European and World level, including Claire Crosbie, Elaine O'Toole, Nicky Orr, Stevi-Lee Orr and Gary Hutchison to name but a few. Alan Wallace, himself, was a member of previous Scottish teams and was a previous winner on the individual Gold Medal winner at the European Championship in Russia.
