## The Centre in Livingston seeks a new Charity of the Year

Patrick Robbertze, Centre Director at The Centre, said: "We are delighted that we were able to support West Lothian Youth Foundation during 2018, to help raise awareness of the great work they do in the community.

"Our thanks and appreciation go to all of our shoppers who dug deep at our events to donate money to WLYF and we wish them all the very best in the future."
