Men's hockey — Grange hope Wildcats don't bite back

Grange had to dig deep to edge success-hungry Western Wildcats when the sides met at Fettes College in Edinburgh earlier this season.

The gutsy 3-2 win could prove a defining moment as the champions bid to retain the Division One title.

Watsonians host Edinburgh University at Tipperlin and they shared a point in a 2-2 draw when they travelled to Peffermill earlier in the campaign.

Pointless Aberdeen, who prop up the table, host fourth-placed Hillhead while Grove are at Uddingston, who are sixth, with fifth-placed Clydesdale entertaining struggling Kelburne who are second bottom of the table.
