SCO ReConnect — workshop for people living with dementia

A special workshop given by the Scottish Chamber Orchestra will take place on Monday 11 March 2019. This is part of the orchestra's **ReConnect**programme — a series of interactive music workshops for people living with dementia.

Delivered by the Scottish Chamber Orchestra in partnership with the University of Edinburgh and the Royal Edinburgh Hospital, over the last six years SCO ReConnect has taken place in hospital settings.

The workshop will be part of St Cecilia's Hall's Mad Hatter, Grey Matter Festival 2019 (taking place in Brain Awareness Week) which aims to explore creativity and neuroscience.
