Harlaw and Threipmuir are both fishing well on the eve of the introduction of an evening ticket from May until August.

Evening permit prices are £15 taking two fish home and £10 for catch and release and permits start from 5.00pm.

Rosslynlee Fishery near Rosewell prepare to introduce two tagged fish with a cash prize and the water continues to fish well with buzzers, black rabbit, cats whisker, hot-head damsel, bloodworms have proving among the best.

And Rab Sneddon had a brilliant day at Morton Fishings with 11 fish while Jim Thompson was close behind with seven fish. Both men fished muddler patterns.
