Former Edinburgh Monarchs skipper Craig Cook led Glasgow to a 56-34 win over Berwick in the SGB Championship Shield at Ashfield.

The Premiership side put on a powerful display with another ex-Monarch Sam Masters scoring strongly on 13 points with Kyle Howarth adding 11 points.

Josh Pickering (pictured) led the way for the home side on 11 points whilst new signing Cameron Heeps added ten points.

Heeps said: "I felt I rode well against good guys. I'm pleased. I could have done with making more starts but that will come. I feel like it's time in my career for stepping up."
