This year, the Festival celebrates its 30<sup>th</sup> year and the milestone programme features 15 shows from eight countries with a mixture of visually stunning and deeply engaging

productions. Whether it's a magical family show featuring an invisible man, a modern fairytale about triplets sisters abandoned in a forest, or a superhero who doesn't feel up to the job anymore, audiences are in for a treat. And whatever you do, don't miss Punchdrunk's site-specific show set in a warehouse in Leith – it will take you on an immersive journey that will be hard to forget!

The Festival opens today with a free Family Day at the National Museum of Scotland, featuring pop-up performances and activities. From colourful walkabout characters including drag kings, giant crows and oversized eyeballs, to live music and impossible dance routines families are in for a surprise.

The rest of the Festival then quicks off from Monday in venues all over Edinburgh. **There are still tickets for most Festival shows, especially over the final weekend (1-2 June).**
