Y/Our Linen Stories Leith Exhibition – on this weekend

Tomorrow and on Sunday the touring exhibition Y/Our Linen Stories makes another stop at Customs Lane in Leith. There will be a pop-up exhibition and displays focussing on migration and maritime cultures — and a lobster pot.

The lobster pot has been used by fashion designer Claudia Escobar to treat a piece of linen woven specially for her. She dunked the material in the harbour at Newhaven and allowed lobsters and sea snails to have their own effect on the material. After this the material is rinsed in the Water of Leith at source and will then be used to make 'breeks'.

This is the inaugural Material World production by Journeys in Design. There will be work by contemporary designers along with tales of flax and linen heritage and production.

The exhibition also featured the Edinburgh City Maritime Heritage box on loan from the City of Edinburgh Council and a maritime display from SS Explorer.
