

Early Day Motion at Holyrood supporting charity fundraising

Edinburgh based couple Matthew Waterston and Hannah Melville have raised almost £25,000 in support of St Columba's Hospice, Alzheimer Scotland and Macmillan Cancer Support.

The couple cycled the equivalent of the width of Canada, 6,400 km, in 36 days and ran the length of Scotland, 290 km, in one week.
