player spurned another opportunity when he hit the side netting just before half time.

to make an impact, and no one was surprised when East Fife equalised ten

minutes into the second half. A cross from Wallace was met by Duggan who

drilled the ball past Hearts keeper Bobby Zlamal who perhaps should have done better.

that was the end of the scoring although Hearts Steven MacLean really should

have won the game for the visitors when he missed a tantalising cross from Jake

Mulraney and a golden chance went abegging.

point for Hearts was enough to see them qualify for the next round but the

afternoon was tainted somewhat when East Fife won the resultant penalty shoot-out

7-6 — Hearts Aaron Hickey missing the Gorgie side's final spot kick — to earn

the bonus point. Hearts unconvincing performances will mean

when the draw for the knock-out stage takes place, meaning they could face

Celtic, Rangers, Aberdeen or city rivals Hibernian.
