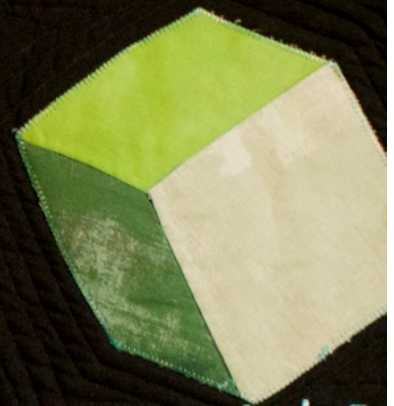

my hobby for life



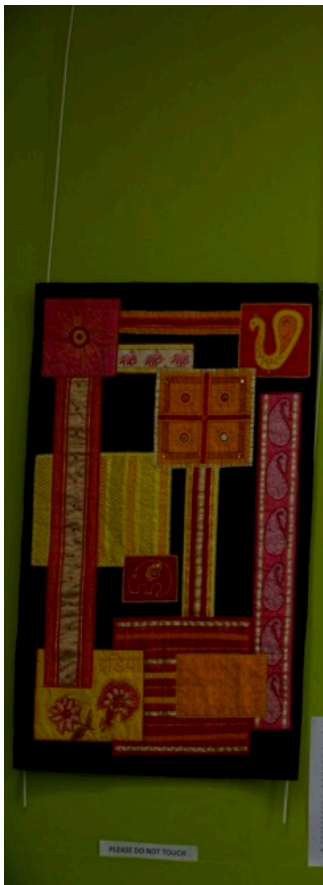

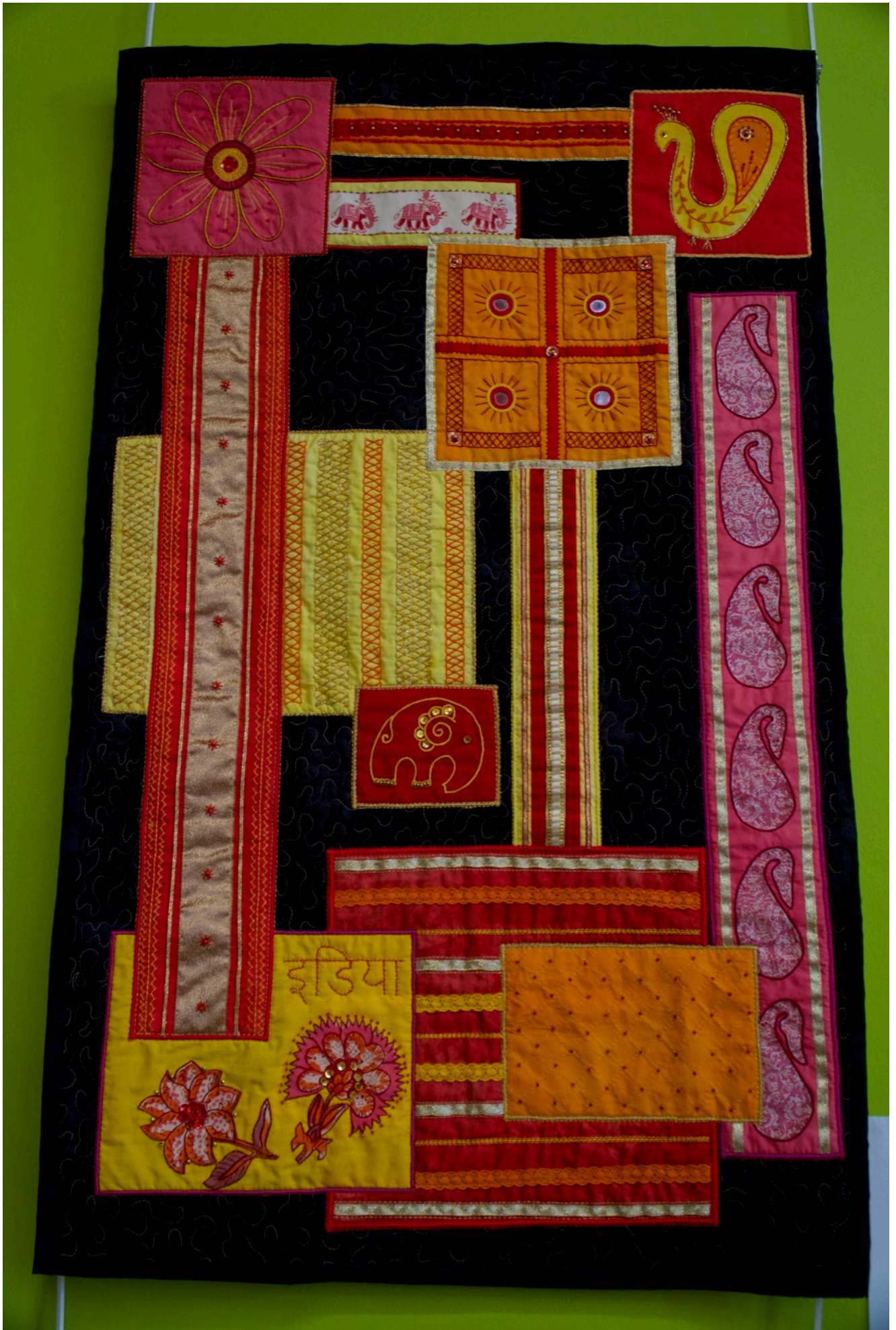
