The Money Talk Team will be at Westside Plaza in Wester Hailes on 28 September 2019 to try and help anyone with money difficulties. Their remit is to chat to people about finances, help them reduce household bills and check that they are getting all the benefits they are entitled to.

There are around 450,000 cases of unclaimed benefits in Scotland and this service should be able to help low-income families identify where they can get more financial support.
