Anyone fishing fly only will be able to fish for the day for f10 and that is catch and return only.

The opening hours are 9am to 5pm and it is bank fishing only as all boats are now out of the water.

It is the third year that Karen has hosted the promotion and it has been successful in the previous two.

She said: "The aim is to clear out fish and not leave them for cormorants which come in over the winter.

"Anglers can use any method, bait, ledger and even fly and they keep what they catch. It does not matter what size the fish are."

And there are fish to be had. One angler hooked a 5lb Tiger trout just outside Karen's HQ in his second cast at the weekend.

She added: "We'll keep going until November 3 if we can but it all depends on the weather."

Meanwhile, Glencorse Reservoir above Flotterstone is now closed for the season.
