Rasmus Jensen claimed 11 points and Claus Vissing, a former Berwick Bandits racer, five in the runaway win.

Edinburgh Monarchs duo Cameron Heeps and James Sarjeant struggled on the night for Witches. Heeps and Sarjeant both scored one point in the crushing defeat.
